## Prevent Plagiarism with



### What is Turnitin?

Turnitin is a web-based plagiarism detection software which could be used as a deterrent to plagiarism and also as an educational tool to teach students how to work with sources and to improve paraphrasing and quoting skills.

### How does it work?

When a student uploads a paper to Turnitin, the paper is compared to billions of books/publications; over 14 billion web pages; and 150 million student papers. The results returned will show matches of the student paper to content from the Turnitin database. This comparison document is called an originality report.



Blue	No matching words
Green	1-24% similarity index
Yellow	25-49% similarity index
Orange	50-74% similarity index
Red	75-100% similarity index

The originality report will also show a percentage and a corresponding color indicating the percentage of similarity index. The percentage is generated by the amount of similar or matching text compared to the number of words in the submission in total.

PSZ has subscribed the license for accessing the software for UTM staffs/students since 2010. Only registered user (UTM staff or student) is allowed to use the software. To login, user is required to have a UTM official email address such as **xxxx@live.utm.my** or **xxxx@utm.my**.

The password will be sent by **www.turnitin.com** to the applicants' UTM email account once the account was created by the user.

## Turnitin : Enrolling in a Class

Students must enroll in a class before they can begin using Turnitin. In order to enroll in a class, the student must have the class ID and enrollment password which can only be distributed by the class instructor. Students can enroll in multiple classes from the same user profile.

<p>1. Click the "Create Account" link to the left of the Sign in button on the Turnitin homepage</p>	
<p>2. Click on the student link from the Create a New Turnitin Account screen</p>	
<p>3. Enter your class ID and enrollment password in the appropriate fields. *Class ID/Class Enrollment Password - is provided by your lecturer, supervisor or instructor.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Example to enroll:</b> <b>PSZ_Assignment Class</b> <b>Class ID: 3944804    Class Enrollment Password: password</b></p>	
<p>4. Enter your first name, your last name, and the e-mail address you would like to be associated with your Turnitin account (this will be your user name)</p>	
<p>5. Enter (and re-enter) the password you would like to use as your Turnitin login password * All passwords in Turnitin are case sensitive. Turnitin user login passwords must be between 6-12 character in length and contain both letters and numbers</p>	
<p>6. Select a secret question using the secret question pull down menu, enter an answer. *You will need to remember your secret question and answer if you forget your login password in the future. Please select the question with this in mind and answer the question with the correct response.</p>	
<p>7. Review the Turnitin user agreement and click to agree and finalize user profile creation</p>	

Students with pre-existing user profiles can use the 'enroll in a class' tab to enroll in additional classes.





# Using turnitin® How Do I Submit a Paper?

<p>1. Click the "Create Account" link to the left of the Sign in button on the Turnitin homepage</p>	
<p>2. Click on the Submit button to the right of the assignment name</p>	
<p>3. Enter your first and last name, and paper title for the submission in the appropriate fields.</p> <p>Note: File to upload must be less than 20 MB</p>	
<p>4. Click browse to find the file on your computer and click open.</p>	
<p>5. Click upload</p>	
<p>6. Uploading file in progress</p>	
<p>7. Review the file and click on the "Submit" button to finalize the submission</p>	



Only instructors and students can submit papers to classes in Turnitin. Students can submit papers through either the file upload or cut and paste method. If the student has the file he or she would like to submit in an accepted file format on his or her computer, he or she can use the single file upload method as shown in the next table.

## Library Visits and Visitors for January to March 2011

The Library had the honour of welcoming a visit from a 20 member delegation under the 'Program Tautan Ukhuwah Isteri-isteri Pegawai Kanan UTM bersama Y. Dipertua WANGI' on 27 January 2011. The visitors led by Datin Dr. Zainah Moktar, the wife of UTM Vice Chancellor were briefed about the facilities and services offered by the Library including membership specifically for UTM staff family members.
