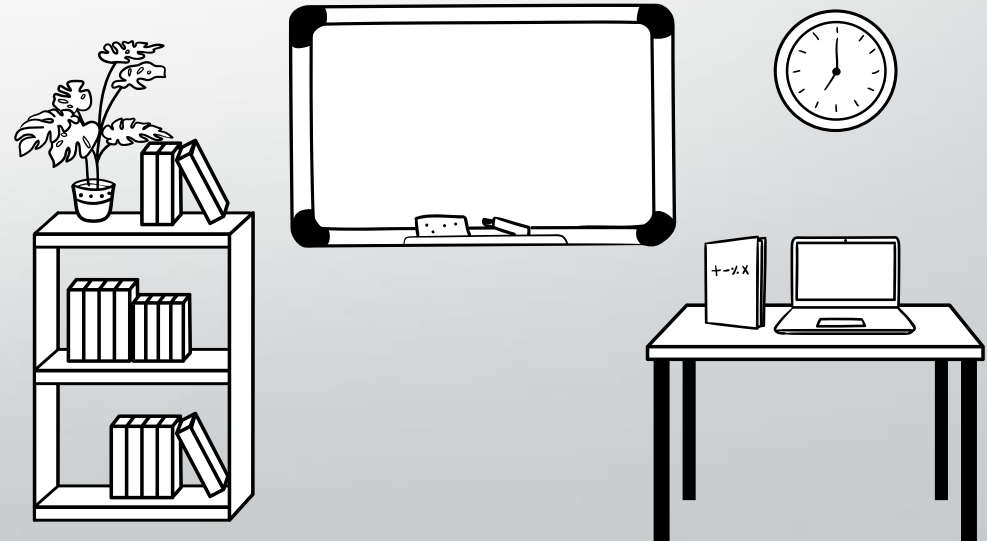

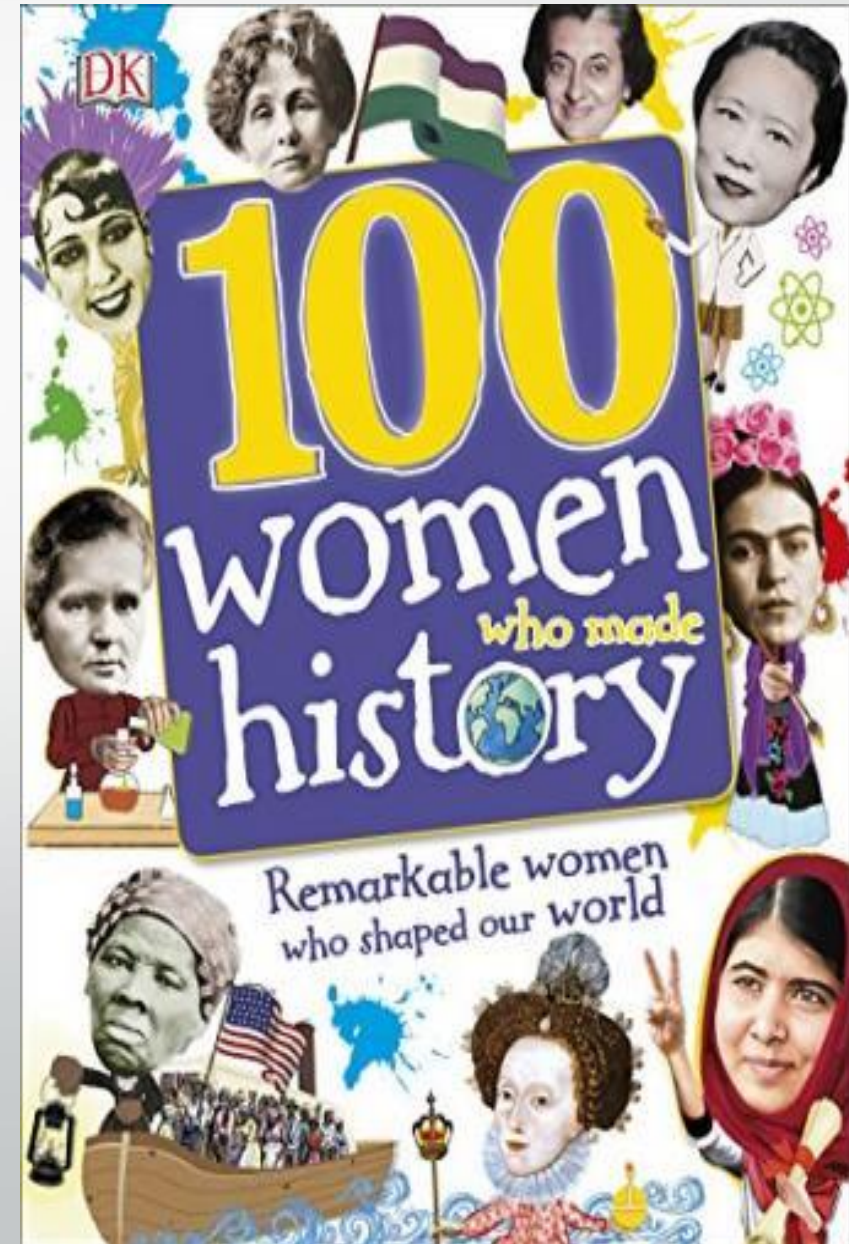

Born in 1965, Joanne Rowling grew up in Gloucestershire, UK, surrounded by books. At the age of six, she **wrote her first story**, about a rabbit with measles. In 1990, she dreamed up the idea for her **BOY-WIZARD, HARRY POTTER**, while delayed on a train. *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone* was published seven years later.

The **mountain gorilla population was rapidly dwindling** in Rwanda due to poaching and loss of habitat. Fossey set out to **UNDERSTAND AND PROTECT** the remaining gorillas. To get close to them, **she imitated their behavior**, scratching herself, beating her chest, and copying the gorillas' belch-like calls.

Fossey was buried next to her favorite gorilla, Digit, who was killed by poachers.

### A new life in Paris

Born in southwestern France in 1748, Olympe de Gouges *moved to Paris* when she was just 22. She was drawn to the **crowd of writers and artists** who met in the salons (drawing rooms) of well-to-do ladies. She soon began to write plays and pamphlets with a **POLITICAL MESSAGE.**

**By the way...**  
My real name was Marie Gouze. My pen name, Olympe de Gouges, was a combination of my parents' names—Olympe Misset and Pierre Gouze.

De Gouges's political writings led to her execution by guillotine in 1793.

She defied the age to rule with power, STRENGTH, and intelligence.



### Turbulent childhood

Elizabeth was just two years old when her father, King Henry VIII, had her mother executed in 1536 after she failed to produce a male heir. Elizabeth and her older half-sister Mary were *exiled from the royal court*, but were eventually brought back into the line of succession. Elizabeth **BECAME QUEEN** after Mary's death in 1558.

### The Golden Age

Following the persecution of Protestants during the reign of her Catholic half-sister, Mary I, Elizabeth worked to **RESTORE RELIGIOUS STABILITY**. Foreign trade flourished, and explorers such as Sir Francis Drake sought out new territory for England abroad. Elizabeth's reign was also a **period of great cultural achievement**, seeing the emergence of outstanding artists such as

## Joan of Arc

### Mission from God

Joan was born into a peasant family in France in 1412. When she was 13, she believed **angels and saints spoke** to her, revealing **GOD'S PLAN** for her: Joan would help defeat the English in the Hundred Years' War and install Charles, heir to the French throne, as **King of France**. It took Joan a few years to work up the courage to tell Charles.

### Ready for battle

Joan rode for 11 days, through enemy territory, to reach Charles and tell him her mission. At first, he refused to take her seriously, but **Joan eventually won him over**. Royal craftsmen made Joan a **special suit of armor**. Joan was ready to

The only female prime minister of India, Indira Gandhi transformed her nation and inspired the birth of a new country.

India's own IRON LADY

**Independence struggle**  
The only child of Indian political leader Jawaharlal Nehru and his wife Kamala, Indira was born in 1917. While her father campaigned for **INDEPENDENCE FROM BRITISH RULE** under the banner of the **Indian Congress Party**, Indira involved local children in the fight with **posters and demonstrations**. After home tutoring, she attended European boarding schools, and married Feroze Gandhi in 1942.

# Margaret Thatcher

**Iron Lady**  
Originally a research chemist, and then a lawyer, Margaret Thatcher became a Conservative member of parliament (MP) in 1959. Elected party leader, she **BECAME PRIME MINISTER IN 1979**. Renowned for taking a tough stance on many issues, she set about reducing the power of the **trade unions** and raising taxes.

Thatcher's policies transformed the face of Britain, with some of her ideas—such as reducing the power of the unions—having lasting effects **the world**

# Oprah Winfrey

## Poor childhood

Born in Mississippi, Winfrey's early years were marred by poverty and neglect—she was so poor as a child that she wore dresses made from potato sacks. Things began to improve when Winfrey went to live with her father in Nashville, Tennessee. Under his guidance, she EXCELLED at school and won a university scholarship.

## Ratings revolution

Aged 19, Winfrey began co-anchoring the local television news, and by the age of 24, was hosting a television chat show. She joined talk show *A.M. Chicago* in 1984, which became the WILDLY SUCCESSFUL *Oprah Winfrey Show*. Winfrey's interviewing style and warm personality helped her to overcome the unspoken race and gender barriers in television and she soon dominated the ratings.

Did you know?  
Winfrey holds such sway over public opinion that her influence has even been called "The Oprah Effect."
